

STATEMENT OF INTENT – DEPENDENT ADULT (18 years old and over) – Band Division

Binche Whut'en Membership or Tl'azt'en Nation Membership

INSTRUCTIONS

Step 1:

In a referendum held on August 15, 2018, the members of Tl'azt'en Nation voted in favour of separating into two bands: Tl'azt'en Nation and Binche Whut'en. You will need to choose whether you wish for the dependent adult to be a member of Tl'azt'en Nation or Binche Whut'en.

Please fill out this form to make the choice for the dependent adult. This form must be filled out by the adult with authority to act on behalf of the dependent adult.

Step 2:

If you wish for the dependent adult to become a member of Binche Whut'en, please include a copy of your valid (not expired) identity document issued by a federal, provincial, territorial or state government authority. Your identity document must include: (1) name, (2) date of birth, (3) photo, and (4) signature. Examples of identity documents include: driver's license; Secure Certificate of Indian Status ("SCIS" or status card); passport.

If you do not have an identity document that includes your name, date of birth, photo and signature, please include a copy of any identity document you have **and** complete a Guarantor Declaration (attached) and include it with this form.

If you choose for the dependent adult to continue to be member of the Tl'azt'en Nation, you do not need to include a copy of your valid identity document.

If the Statement of Intent for the dependent adult is incomplete, further information may be requested. **Please note that you must submit one SOI form per person. If you wish to receive additional copies, please contact Stephen Chung (Stephen.Chung@canada.ca) or visit your band office.**

We share the personal information you give us internally among INAC sectors, and with various federal, provincial and/or territorial government departments or agencies, including for the provision of benefits and services conferred exclusively to those who are registered. We may also disclose a First Nation's departmentally-maintained Band List to its respected council. The information collected as described in Personal Information Bank AANDC PPU110 (Info Source <http://www.aadnc-aandc.gc.ca/eng/1100100011039/1100100011040>), will be retained for 30 years after the last administrative action and then transferred to Library and Archives Canada. As stated in the *Privacy Act*, you have the right to access your personal information and request changes to incorrect information.
